

2016 Health-Related Legislation Under Consideration by the Missouri General Assembly

Updated 2/18/2016

The 98th Missouri General Assembly convenes its second regular session on January 6, 2016. More than 100 bills under consideration may affect the health of Missourians. To help our partners navigate the state policymaking process, MFH tracks health-related bills and provides updates through the end of the legislative session in May.
