Missouri Foundation for Health 2020 Health-Related Legislation Under Consideration by the Missouri General Assembly Updated 7/24/2020

The 100th Missouri General Assembly convenes its second regular session on January 8, 2019. More than 100 bills under consideration may affect the health of Missourians. To help our partners navigate the state policymaking process, Missouri Foundation for Health tracks healthrelated bills and provides updates through the end of the legislative session in May.

An overview of the Missouri legislative process is available in this chart. Each step in the process has a number:

Additionally, each bill is categorized by health-related topic(s), including: private insurance; health care value; safety net (TANF, SNAP, Medicaid/MO HealthNet, EITC, etc.); Behavioral Health (substance use and mental health); children & infants; criminal justice; health care workforce; health care facilities; prescription drugs; women's health; oral health; prevention & awareness (public health, infrastructure, and healthy and active living); firearms & violence prevention; budget & tax; and other (includes legal, civil rights, etc.).

This bill designates mental health awareness months; changes provisions related to automated external defibrillators; prohibits vapor product usage in certain areas; requires coverage for COVID-19 testing; and requires health care providers to distribute information to new parents about postpartum depression and allows women receiving mental health treatment for postpartum depression within 60 days of birth to be eligible for MO HealthNet Coverage for mental health services for an additional 12 months.	7/13/20 - Approved by Governor

This bill creates the Missouri local government expenditure database, allows the governing body of any county to levy a sales tax for the purpose of funding early childhood education programs, and modifies ballot language required for local use tax on out of state sellers.	7/14/20 - Vetoed by Governor

16	Private Insurance	<u>SB 551</u>	<u>Wieland, Paul</u>	Modifies several provisions related to insurance. This bill regulates removes certain requirements for recipients of organ donation by prohibiting providers from choosing recipients based on a recipient's physical, mental, or congenital disability or their ability to live independently. The bill also prohibits one's status as a living organ donor to be a sole factor in change in insurance policy or coverage. The bill mandates health insurance coverage of breast cancer imaging that is deemed necessary by a physician.	7/14/20 - Approved by Governor

This bill establishes a statewide telehealth network for forensic examination training and support; establishes the survivor's bill of rights for victims of sexual assault; creates a task force to collect data on sexual assault in the state and develop a final report; and creates an electronic tracking system for rape kits that victims can access.	7/13/20 - Approved by Governor

16	Other	<u>SB 631</u>	<u>Hegeman, Dan</u>	Modifies provisions relating to elections, including expanded eligibility for absentee voting due to COVID-19 and allows any registered voter to cast a mail-in ballot in 2020.	6/4/20 - Approved by Governor
