INFANT MORTALITY REDUCTION INITIATIVE Planning for Impact 2013–2014: Year in Review

The Initiative

Missouri Foundation for Health established the Infant Mortality Reduction Initiative (IMRI) in 2013 to address high infant mortality rates in St. Louis (St. Louis Effort) and the six county region of the Bootheel (Bootheel Effort). The IMRI is a place-based, community driven initiative, working within the collective impact framework. In Year 1, the Foundation invested in three organizations, one in St. Louis and two in the Bootheel, to provide backbone support to the collective impact initiative. The focus of Year 1 was on planning and increasing readiness for implementation of collective impact.
