# Medicaid Expansion Education for Educators: Higher Education

# About this Toolkit

Many adults are heading to the classroom during "back-to-school" season, including those heading to college campuses, trade schools, and other higher-learning settings. Many may be eligible for Missouri Medicaid, also known as MO HealthNet, thanks to new rules. This is a great chance to make sure health insurance is on their own back-to-school checklist. Schools can help to raise awareness of Missouri Medicaid and how to enroll - helping their students maintain their health and focus on their studies. This toolkit includes resources for staff to help communicate to students who may not have health insurance.

- Community colleges
- Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs), colleges, and universities near you
- Trade and professional schools

This toolkit can be shared with entities within these institutions, such as:

Use these messages to engage potential higher education partners

- Students' physical and mental well-being are key to their success in the classroom and beyond. With access to low-cost or free health insurance through Missouri Medicaid, also known as MO HealthNet, there's one less thing to worry about—so they can focus on learning and thriving.
- Your students may not be aware that health insurance may now be within reach. Missouri Medicaid has recently expanded to cover more people. That means more students may be able to get low-cost or free health insurance and some peace of mind.
- Health insurance through Missouri Medicaid gives students access to important health care services, including doctor visits, emergency care, mental health services, and more.

### Use these messages to educate students about their new options

- Between school, work, and all the things you've got going in your life, you shouldn't have to worry about your health or an unexpected hospital bill. There's good news. The rules around who qualifies for Missouri Medicaid have changed. More adults (19-64) can now get low-cost or free health insurance through Missouri Medicaid, also known as MO HealthNet.
- Are you worried about your health? Has it been a long time since you've seen a doctor? When you have health insurance, you can take care of yourself and your family.
- Health insurance through Missouri Medicaid gives you access to health care professionals, right from home. Right now, you could see many doctors through virtual, telehealth visits.
- When you are sick or injured, you should be focused on getting better, not how you are going to pay for health care. When you have health insurance through Missouri Medicaid, you can get the care you need without worrying about going into debt.
- Broken bones and accidents can mean costly trips to the emergency room and follow-up care. With health insurance through Missouri Medicaid, you can be prepared for the unexpected.

Use these messages when talking to staff who may need health insurance

If your employees with lower incomes do not have health insurance, they may qualify for Medicaid, known in Missouri as MO HealthNet. Medicaid puts health care within reach. Healthy employees are less likely to miss work and more likely to be productive and happy in their job. That's good for your employees and good for your school.

#### Use this language to pitch a story about Medicaid to your local school/university newspaper.

The rules have changed, and Missouri Medicaid has expanded to cover more people. Now, many adults who were not eligible before may be able to get free or low-cost health insurance, including many students. Students over 19 years of age can check to see if they qualify for Missouri Medicaid as they head back to class this fall. For the first time, more adults qualify for low-cost or free health insurance through MO HealthNet.

MO HealthNet covers doctor visits, emergency care, mental health services, and more. This means they can get the care they need to succeed in the classroom and beyond. "We want our students to be healthy and thrive, and for those who are eligible, this could be a great opportunity to get insurance," [School/University staff member] said. "Even if they tried to get coverage through Missouri Medicaid in the past, it's worth checking again - they may now be able to enroll."
